

Welcome to the 2013 New Nordic Films

WE ARE PROUD TO PRESENT one of the most comprehensive programmes ever in the history of New Nordic Films. No less than 25 brand new films, 10 works in progress, 22 film producers seeking cofinancing and co-production partners, and 7 pitches by script writers seeking producers are brought to you in the course of 4 days.

We have spent many enjoyable hours watching the films represented in the market programme, all of them with a distinctiveness making them well worth experiencing.

Some by veterans such as Per Fly, Søren Kragh-Jacobsen and Nils Malmros, others made by first-time filmmakers like Karin Fahlen, Iram Haq and Peter Franzén. The children's films in the market do not put to shame the good international reputation of Nordic children's films, and we are especially pleased to see a strong Icelandic presence this year.

In the Works in Progress we have ten upcoming films, all to premiere during the winter of 2013/2014. These will be presented in two sections each lasting roughly one hour, and we have been lucky to get our own Tonje Hardersen as a moderator this year.

For the co-production forum we received 76 applications, making it a tough process selecting the final line-up of 22 projects with experienced and capable directors and producers behind them. When the forum started up eight years ago, it included a focus on British producers. A focus which we have brought back this year, in co-operation



with Film London and their Production Finance Market. We hope that these presentations will lead to new and good constellations of collaborations and financing across borders. The moderators are yet again Petri Kemppinen and Reetta Hautamäki from the Finnish Film Foundation

For the third year in a row, in co-operation with The Writer's Guild of Norway, we have a session where seven Nordic script writers are pitching their scripts to the international industry. The pitches are mainly aimed towards producers, but should be of interest to everyone participating in creative processes.

Our ambition, in addition to be a lively film market and a creative co-production forum, is to be an important meeting place for the industry to further strengthen co-operation and to be an arena where films can be created, bought, sold and marketed internationally.

Please use this opportunity to get to know each other, speak to people you do not already know and have fun! This is the best way to create a platform for fruitful co-operation and professional exchanges.

We are at your service during these four days, so do not hesitate to get in touch with us. Enjoy!

Nordic Children's Films

New report about how Nordic children's films can reach a wider audience

HOW MANY Nordic children's films are distributed outside its own production country, and why is it that even children's films that are doing well in their home country have great difficulty reaching a Nordic audience? The answers to these questions and suggestions for improvements are given in a new Nordic report presented at the Norwegian International Film Festival on Monday 19. August.

Biografcentralen in Sweden has, with support from Nordic Culture Fund and Film & Kino from Norway, mapped out Nordic children's films crossing the Nordic borders in the period of 2008 to 2011. In dialogue with producers, distributors and cinema managers, the report is a deep exploration of questions around the absence of Nordic children's films in movie theatres.

The report is presented by **Jens Lanestrand**, General Manager at Biografcentralen. Then a panel discussion follows, which includes **Anna Serner** of the Swedish Film Institute, **Henrik Bo Nielsen** of the Danish Film Institute and Ivar Køhn of the Norwegian Film Institute. The moderator is Cecilie Stranger-Thorsen.

The report "Joing Niko - On its Way to the Stars" and the seminar itself will be in English.

Biografcentralen is an industry organisation for cinemas showing quality films. Children's films have become an important distinctive mark for Biografcentralen, through, for example, the new Best Children's Cinema Award, general information and the current report, which attempts to help increase the volume of quality children's films in theatrical release.

Cecilie Stranger-Thorsen has worked with Nordic co-operation within films, TV and games since 2004, as a project manager and digital producer. She is currently developing digital projects and business models for creative producers and organisations in the Nordic countries, as well as being chairwoman of the International Children and Young People's Film Festival in Malmö.

Sequencing, giving feedback and the three C's

FILM STARTS WITH A STORY. A character. A plot. And from that the writer constructs his screenplay. During this process writers get a lot of feedback; from producers, distrubutors, financiers and so forth. There are several people who read the script, and writers love feedback, when it follows the three C's: Concrete, Concise, Constructive.

Using the sequence-approach, based on the idea that a film is divided into eight sequences, writer Jan Trygve Røyneland wants to give readers a tool so that when giving feedback on a script you can be concrete, concise and constructive.

Røyneland has written a number of feature films and TV shows that are in production or in development. He has won numerous pitch competitions and is running the script podcast Utcast for Writers' Guild of Norway.

Confirmed Panelists:

Leidulv Risan has written, directed and produced films for decades. He has been a professor at The Norwegian Film School, both in direction and screenplay and is now script consultant at the Norwegian Film Institute.

Linn-Jeaneth Kyed has written the Oscar nominated short film *Tuba Atlantic* (2010), as well as TV shows and movies in production, development and post-production. Kyed is one of the experts in Norway on sequence model.

Lars Gudmestad is one of Norway's most successfull scriptwriters with amongst others *Headhunters* (2011) and *The Orheim Company* (2012) on his resume. He works as Feature Film Commissioner at the Norwegian Film Institute.

Finn Gjerdrum has produced films since the early '90s, and among his upcoming titles are *A Thousand Times Good Night* by Erik Poppe and *The Prize Idiot* by Hans Petter Moland.

Emma thinks she has lost Miss Rabbit forever, and nothing can make her happy again. But on her birthday, Emma doesn't just get one great surprise, she gets two!

Chasing the Wind

ANNA HASN'T SEEN HER FAMILY for a decade. She has moved to Berlin, where she now works as a fashion designer, happily living with Mathias. When her grandmother dies, she reluctantly returns to her small childhood town in Norway to take care of the arrangements and stays with her grumpy grandfather. But in the week leading up to the funeral, nothing goes according to plans, and secrets that has been kept safe for too long are soon revealed. Anna is forced to reconsider how she lives her life and learn to care for the ones she really loves.

Chasing the Wind is a humorous and melancholic love story that shows how communicating with your own family is the most difficult communication of all.


Detective Downs

ROBERT RUNS HIS OWN detective office, but never gets any cases. No one believes he can accomplish anything. Even his father, who is a police investigator, rejects him. Then a mysterious woman shows up. The legendary skater Olav Starr is missing, and his family need an incompetent detective to pacify a senile grandmother. Robert is perfect for the job, and soon he is entangled in Olav's secret life – and not without danger. But when Robert reveals his investigation method everyone is in for a surprise.



BÅRD BREIEN (b. 1971) received an Amanda Award nomination for his first short, Frank's Prolapse (2003). The Art of Negative Thinking (2006) marked his feature film debut, both as screenwriter and director. The film won several international awards, including the Czech Lion for best foreign film, Best Director at the Karlovy Vary Film Festival and Best Screenplay at Torino Film Festival.







And Breathe Normally

SYNOPSIS: At the edge of Iceland's Reykjanes peninsula, a quiet and unassuming Keflavik airport rests, surrounded by a vast volcanic landscape and the periodic soaring of an airplane. It is here that the young and struggling Lara, a border-patrol officer in training, will encounter Ajay, an asylum seeker from Uganda. The latter finds herself apprehended at the airport due to false documentation, a process Lara participates in as an ambitious trainee who feels compelled to prove herself as a worthy guardian of the law. While Ajay is incarcerated temporarily, the seemingly ambitious Lara is secretly grappling with securing a home for her children and proving to social workers that she is indeed a fit mother. Unbeknownst to them, their paths will continue to periodically intersect – culminating with Ajay coming to Lara's rescue in a moment of despair following foreclosure. An unlikely bond will form, compelling Lara to risk her newfound job in the name of justice.

Atmospheric and lyrical, this is a film about finding one's place in the world.

ISOLD UGGADÓTTIR is a two-time winner of the Icelandic Academy Awards for best short, and four-time nominee. Her films have been screened at over 100 festivals, including Sundance, Telluride and ND/NF in New York, winning 30 awards. She holds an MFA from Columbia and was named one of the rising stars of Icelandic film by Screen International.

SKULI FR. MALMQUIST, co-founder of Zik Zak and member of ACE, has produced and sold films to over 100 territories, winning more than 100 awards. Titles include *Volcano* (2011, Cannes), *Last Farm* (2004, Oscar Nominee), *Undercurrent* (2010, Nominee, Nordic Council Film Prize), *The Good Heart* (2009, with Brian Cox and Paul Dano) and the forthcoming *Z for Zachariah* (directed by Craig Zobel).

The Beacon

SYNOPSIS: Peter is a surgeon who has retreated to a lighthouse in the middle of the ocean to reorganise his life. Alone on this rock, with no boat in sight and no communication to the outside world, he wakes up feeling terrible from the mix of pills and liquor he had the night before. He goes out to clear his head, only to find a young Asian boy, about 8-years-old, floating in the water. Peter pulls him ashore and resuscitates him. They have no common language and the boy is terrified. It takes a while for him to trust Peter or to eat the food Peter offers. When he eats too much, too quickly, he throws up a small rubber bag. Peter makes him vomit again and more rubber bags, with over half a kilo drugs, come back up. Peter finds a GPS locator in one of the bags and knows that someone will follow. He will play a cat and mouse game to save the child's life.

JP (JUKKA-PEKK) SILL has an MA from the Aalto University School of Art and Design Helsinki. His first student film won the grand prix at the Cilect Festival in Karlovy Vary. His first feature film *Young Gods* (2003), about teenagers secretly videotaping their sex lives, caused an uproar in Finland. The rock movie *Ganes* was a box office hit in Finland in 2007. His fourth feature film, *Härmä*, a western with knives, opened in Finland in 2012.

Formula

Jonas is to be the minder for Irina, an illegal Ukrainian immigrant who is in debt to Angela and who is made to travel to Panama with a young baby, returning with formula tins full of cocaine.

In Panama Irina befriends a young gangster and inadvertently causes him to be shot when the deal goes bad. Irina escapes unhurt, but in London Jonas has to talk Ray out of his rage against her. Irina evades detection on her return journey, but when Angela reveals that the baby is to be immediately returned to Panama, Irina snaps and kidnaps him. A Perfect Host

Björk, an aging fashion model, helps them move into one of the many empty houses. The Indians confide in Björk, after the engineer has had a hunting accident, that they are in serious financial straits. Björk pressures the wife to be a paid surrogate mother becauses she does not want to ruin her own figure.

As Christmas nears, Uncle, the Indian's benefactor, comes from India to collect his debt, but finds his nephew turning into a Western degenerate and his wife's pregnancy suspect. Therefore Uncle must kill her for the honour of the family. He decides to make his move after the Christmas festivities.

The Indians decide to go home to India, because they have a duty towards their family. This causes a dilemma, since the woman is carrying Björk's baby.


Scrappers! A Northern Western

SYNOPSIS: When the bank clerk Mirko (in his mid-thirties) is picked up rather urgently by a pair of strange fellows at his bank and driven to a provincial town nearby, his well-organized life suddenly falls apart. He learns that he is the son and heir of Fiete, a recently passed away scrap dealer of some dodgy renown. In an instant, Mirko finds himself at his father's funeral – and has come to terms with his heritage.

As the involuntary head of the family, Mirko has to help his raffish tribe to keep their scrap yard which is about to be sacked by the city authorities and their slick representative Bernhard Engels. Scrap, Mirko learns, has become the new gold – and Engels wants his own personal share of it.

As if this wasn't bad enough, Mirko's half-brother Letscho, uneducated yet streetwise, doesn't accept Mirko's presence and starts his own feud. Since only a well-planned train robbery can save the yard, the two brothers have to stack up their skills and eventually act like a real family.

MAX ZÄHLE has been working as an editor and director of commercials, music videos and fiction formats since 2002. In 2010 he graduated from Hamburg Media School in film directing. His graduation film *Raju* won the Student Academy Award in 2011 and a nomination for best Live Action Short at the 2012 Academy Awards. *Scrappers!* is his feature debut.

The Shadows

SYNOPSIS: Gerda passes away, alone in her flat, at the age of 92. As they look for any heirs or descendants the town's social services department contacts the family of Axel Geithner, where she had been employed for more than 20 years. A former winner of the Nobel Prize for Literature, Axel is today trapped in bed-ridden silence after a stroke. His son Thomas, who lives and works in his father's shadow, is called upon to provide whatever information there may be about the old woman.

After Gerda's death, the family's past comes to light, revealing a multitude of murky secrets. The life of the former domestic, whose destiny was intimately linked to the family's, constantly forces Thomas to face his own father's past, as well as the fate of his dead sister. For the lives of Axel, a national intellectual and moral figurehead, of his wife Alice, and Gerda are linked in a web of dark, unspeakable secrets.

LUDOVIC BERNARD is a renowned and respected First AD and Second Unit Director who has worked for Luc Besson for the past ten years. His recent credits include *Three Days to Kill* (2014), *Taken 2* (2012), *Mesrine: Public Enemy* (2008) and *Mesrine: Killer Instinct* (2008). *The Shadows* is his first feature.

FRANCOIS CORNUAU founded the Arsenic agency, which specialises in communication, advertisement and marketing of cultural works.

VINCENT ROGET has a career that spans from French TV's most popular shows about film culture and history, to a four-year association with France's star producer Daniel Toscan Du Plantier. He has produced some forty hours of documentary and five of the most popular French film of the decade with his partner at Same Player Productions, including *Poltergay* (2006) and *Incognito* (2009).

Silent Knowledge

SYNOPSIS: Anna, a young woman, who has just become aware of her own sexuality, knows what she wants. In the house of her foster mother, the village midwife Valborg, she predicts to herself that The Big Love will arrive. In no time Anna believes she has come across her destiny, as she falls heavily in love with Elias, who is much older, married and the father of two children. The situation does not improve by the fact that Elias's wife Rakel is a good friend of Anna's. For a while Anna believes that she has achieved full ownership over him, so she enjoys the power she's got through sex, as well as the physical pleasures, against all the strict moral norms of the 17th century.

Everything could have ended differently, and Anna survives with just a small shock. Unfortunately, below the surface of the community ingredients for an upcoming conflict are growing. A simple theft of rye sheaves turns out to be disastrous, when quarreling neighbours innocently ask for help from judge Nils Psilander, a highly academic newcomer on the small island of Åland. The biggest witch has burst into flames in Sweden-Finland, in the year 1666.

SAARA CANTELL's feature films *Stars Above* (2012) and *Heartbeats* (2010) were awarded the State Quality Price for Films. Both films have travelled well and been awarded at international festivals. Her upcoming feature films are the romantic comedy *The Two and Only Ones* (2013) and the childrens' feature *Onneli & Anneli* (2014).

MARKKU FLINK joined Periferia in 2008. He has produced, written and directed films in the Nordic countries since the 1990s. For Wulff, every moment on the Slave Coast resonates between life and death, profound nature experiences, loss, homesickness and intoxication. And everything goes wrong. In a lost, forgotten and dark chapter of Danish history, Joseph Wulff's story is that of seemingly insurmountable challenges and an adventurous destiny. Although the slave trade has officially ended, it flourishes as never before. Danish coast men engage in unholy alliances with various tribesmen to maintain the flow of slaves along the river Volta.

Wulff's short and tumultuous life in Africa is not only a story of an uncommonly cruel fate, human suffering and moral decay – but also one of man's ability to transcend his time, and the triumphant power of love.

DANIEL DENCIK is educated as a film editor from the Danish Film School. He is also a scriptwriter, writer and director.
