WELCOME TO HAUGESUND!

WE ARE PROUD TO PRESENT a programme that reflects high quality and a strong diversity of the Nordic film production. So hold your breath, with a record number of participants, this year's programme at New Nordic Films is quite extensive!

During these four hectic days, we will screen 23 completed films in our market, of which 14 are market premiers. In our Works in Progress section we present samples from 20 films in post-production, in the Nordic Co-Production Market we present 24 film projects in development, of which seven are part of the initiative Nordic Genre Boost from Nordic Film & TV Fund. In co-operation with the Writers' Guild of Norway six selected scriptwriters looking for directors and producers presents their screenplays.

Our new initiative Books@Haugesund is focusing on the synergy between the book and film industry, and literary agents will pitch books suitable for the big screen. The programme includes an adaptation of books workshop, in collaboration with EAVE, by financing expert Linda Beath. We will highlight the upcoming talents with pitches by Nordic feature film debutants in our new initiative Scandinavian Debut, and we will this year as well screen the best graduation films from the Nordic countries in our programme Next Nordic Generation. We will look into how the European distributors see the evolution of status and the audience's taste of Nordic films and TV in Scandinavian Films for Beginners, a seminar made in collaboration with Europa Distributors.

This year, we have also included TV series at New Nordic Films. Four season premieres will be screened in the market (with the two first episodes of each), and there is one TV drama project presented both in the Nordic Co-Production Market and in Scandinavian Debut.

For the second year, we have the pleasure to reward a film that goes beyond the framework for traditional filmmaking, through the Eurimages Lab Project Award. The eight nominated films are carefully selected because of their cutting edge approach either in form or content. An international jury will give the award to the most promising film nominated to the award in the Works in Progress programme.

We would also encourage you to use this opportunity to mingle, meet and get to know each other well. So please enjoy some pleasurable days together with new and old acquaintances.



SCANDINAVIAN FILMS FOR BEGINNERS: THE CIRCULATION OF NORDIC FILMS IN EUROPE AND BEYOND

TIME: Thursday 24 August at 10:00-11:30 **PLACE:** Scandic Maritim Hotel, Salongene

TODAY, NAMES SUCH AS Lars Von Trier, Ruben Östlund, Aki Kaurismaki and Joachim Trier, along with the wave of Scandinavian Noir productions, are well-known not only by dedicated film buffs, but also by an broad audience. Scandinavian cinema (both films & series) is at the top of its game, but does this mean that releasing a Scandinavian film is easy, whatever the film, whatever the country?

Our panel will look at the evolution of the audience's taste for Scandinavian films (and series) since the new millennium, and the factors that have created such an interest. Distributors from all over Europe will share their experiences and decode which things have changed, and what must remain constant in order to remain on the path of success.

The panel is organized in collaboration with Europa Distribution and New Nordic Films.

MODERATOR:

Wendy Mitchell is the Nordic correspondent and contributing editor at Screen International, which she first joined in 2005 and later served as editor in chief for two years. Mitchell previously worked as staff news editor for Entertainment Weekly in New York and as Managing Editor at indieWIRE.

She is also a Film Programme Manager at the British Council, where she runs the festival selector screening programme in London for the world's top festivals such as Cannes, Berlin, Toronto, Sundance and many more.

SPEAKERS:

Vladimir Kokh created the independent film distribution company KMBO in 2007. KMBO releases 8-10 films in theatres each year and their editorial approach is mainly based on researching new talents and first feature films to introduce to the French market.

Since 2009, they have worked on animation films for young audiences through their LITTLE KMBO label, with theatrical releases dedicated to educational programs. LITTLE KMBO releases 3-4 short film programmes or animation feature films each year.

Kristýna Haklová is the programme coordinator at Film Europe Media Company in Prague, Czech Republic. Film Europe distributes mainly European films and organises four film festivals every year including Be2Can, screening the best of Berlin, Venice and Cannes film festivals, as well as Scandi, showcasing new titles from the Nordic region.

Kristýna graduated from Masaryk University's department of Film Studies and previously worked as a Sales Agent and Open Air Cinema Production Manager at the National Film Archive in Prague.

Matthias Mücke, born in 1973, studied Philosophy and Cultural Science at Humboldt University in Berlin. He worked as publicist, with a main focus on theatrical releases, from 2001 to 2011. Since 2005, he has been a Managing Partner of Neue Visionen Medien and Managing Director of good!movies, an association of ten independent film distributors. Together with his partner Torsten Frehse, he founded the production company Neue Visionen Filmproduktion in 2011.

Marike Muselaers After almost 10 years in sales, acquisitions and co-productions at Lumiere, Marike Muselaers has recently been appointed co-CEO. She is currently focusing on Lumiere's digital strategy, and has just

launched the first Electronic Sell Thru store for TV series in the Benelux.

The Lumiere Group is a full ecosystem in which production, distribution, 3 cinemas and an animation studio all work closely together to bring the best stories to the Benelux audience and the rest of the world. A strong focus on Scandinavian content has always been one of the drivers of Lumiere's success, and the company continues to acquire and coproduce the very best of Scandinavia. The slate for 2017/2018 includes Ruben Ostlund's *The Square*, along with TV series including *The Bridge 4, Monster*, *Occupied 2* and many more.

James King After working as a freelance script reader and a stint doing theatrical sales for independent distributors Verve Pictures, New Waves Films and Arrow Films, James moved to the Institute of Contemporary Arts London where he ran the Film and Cinema Departments for two years. James then briefly worked in the BFI's distribution department before joining Curzon Artificial Eye as Head of Theatrical Sales, where he tries to get exhibitors to play better films. He most recently edited the seventh edition of *enthusiasms*, the UK's most intermittent film journal (1975–present).






THE SWAN



CHRISTIAN IV is the working title of Kasper Skovsbøl's feature debut about great Danish King Christian IV's tempestuous relationship with his second wife, Kirsten Munk. The film depicts the last hours in the life of the King, told exclusively from the horse carriage that transported him on his deathbed, and dives into Christian and Kirsten's turbulent marriage involving accusations of infidelity and attempted murder.

Skovsbøl challenges the cinematic language by creating a diverse and innovative period piece with a tight visual concept, making it possible to produce on an extremely low budget.



KASPER SKOVSBØL (b.1982) was accepted to The Funen Art Academy in 2006, and in 2011 he was accepted to The National Danish Film School. His graduation film *Darkest Moon* was nominated for a Danish Robert. Skovsbøl worked with the same team from film school on his debut feature *Christian IV*, which is now in post-production.

Dramatic scenes mixed with everyday life and wry dialogue makes a perfect blend of light existentialism and strong comic relief.

NORDISK FILM & TV FOND hereby presents the final 7 projects of the Nordic Genre Boost development initiative. The first call was launched in December 2014 and 21 projects have participated in total.

Nordic genre film projects are increasingly stepping into the spotlight as they cross borders within our region and internationally, and rightly so. The genre film trend seems set to continue on a steady course and Nordic Genre Boost has received strong support and interest from our regional and international partners during our 3 years. We have reached our goal of creating a visible platform, attracting attention to Nordic genre filmmakers: most recently at the Nordic Genre Boost Panel at Frontières in Montreal in July, at the Focus Asia market in Udine, as well as at the Cannes Marché/Frontières collaboration during the film festival in May. Nordic Genre Boost offers participants a NOK 200.000 development grant and an intensive development process including 2 residential workshops where the projects shape their development in areas such as script, financing, distribution/sales and post-production. Each workshop is comprised of 1:1 meetings with industry experts, team exchanges, talks and cases/screenings, culminating in the final presentation here at the Nordic Co-Production and Finance Market, where they also wrap up their Genre Boost-experience in the second and final workshop. The first workshop was hosted in collaboration with the Night Visions Festival in Helsinki in April.

As we close shop and send all the projects off into the world, the Nordic Genre Boost team is currently looking into further promotion and support opportunities for the projects as they continue their development, production and distribution, as well as exploring what new Genre Boosts might emerge on the horizon.




